- 4. Junior Counsel—work with prosecution witnesses 3 and 4 to prep for cross-examination; cross-examine defense witnesses 3 and 4
- 5. Junior Counsel—work with prosecution witnesses 5 and 6 to prep for cross-examination; cross-examine defense witnesses 5 and Napoleon
- 6. Witness 1-prep questions (supply to lead prosecutor); prep defense with help of junior counsel
- 7. Witness 2-prep questions (supply to lead prosecutor); prep defense with help of junior counsel
- 8. Witness 3-prep questions (supply to lead prosecutor); prep defense with help of junior counsel
- 9. Witness 4-prep questions (supply to lead prosecutor); prep defense with help of junior counsel
- 10. Witness 5-prep questions (supply to lead prosecutor); prep defense with help of junior counsel
